GREEN-IT-YOURSELF (GIY) FAVORITES

All-Purpose Cleaning Spray

Mix 2 Tbsp. Dr. Bronner's Castile Soap OR 1 ½ tsp. Sal Suds into 16 oz. water in a spray bottle. Spray and wipe down with a damp cloth.

Laundry

3-4 Tbsp. Castile Soap OR 1 ½ Tbsp. Sal Suds in large HE washer. Optional: For extra whitening/brightening, add ¼ c. baking soda to wash cycle and/or ½ c. vinegar to the rinse cycle. Double all amounts for a standard machine.

Dishes (handwashing)

In a squirt bottle, pre-dilute 1:10 Dr. Bronner's Castile Soap with water OR add ½ c. Sal Suds Cleaner into 1 quart of water. Squirt on a scrub brush.

Mopping

Mix ½ c. Dr. Bronner's Castile Soap OR ½ Tbsp. Sal Suds in 3 gallons hot water.

Windows

Fill a spray bottle with half vinegar, half water. Spray and squeegee.

Pet Washing

Wet fur thoroughly, squirt on enough Dr. Bronner's Castile Soap to work into lather. Avoid eyes and ears. Rinse thoroughly. Bathe cats with Baby Unscented only. Wash pet bowls and equipment with Sal Suds or Castile Soap. (Avoid using Tea Tree to wash pets, as tea tree oil can be toxic to them.)

Personal care with Dr. Bronner's Castile Soaps: one product from head to toe!

Hands-Face-Body: Lather Castile Bar Soap or a small squirt of Liquid Soap into wet hands or washcloth.

Foaming Pump Dispenser

1 part Castile Liquid Soap in 3 parts water.

Shaving

Lather Castile Bar Soap or 5-10 drops Castile Liquid Soap into wet hands. Use for face, underarms, or legs.

Makeup Removal

Lather Castile Bar Soap or several drops of Liquid Soap into wet hands. Massage on to wet skin. Rinse.

Wipe-Off Castile Body Wash Spray

Combine 1 ½ tsp. of Castile Soap and 1 c. room temperature water. Lightly spray onto skin and wipe off with clean, damp cloth. Use when bath or shower is not an option.
